The Presenters:

Lynda French is the Executive Director at HEAR in New Hampshire. Lynda has been involved in the field of Deaf Education for over thirty years. Lynda earned her undergraduate degree in Speech and Hearing from Kean University in New Jersey and her Masters degree in Deaf Education from Smith College/Clarke School for the Deaf. Her teaching experience includes both public and private school programs, as well as thirteen years in Early Supports and Services. Lynda helped establish and teaches in HEAR in New Hampshire's Families, Infants, and Toddlers play group. In 2008 she received the Champions for Children Award from the Council for Children and Adolescents with Chronic Health Conditions.

Janet Halley is the Director of M.I.C.E. Jan is an Occupational Therapist with 30 years of experience working with infants and toddlers with vision and hearing loss. She specializes in child development, the impact of a vision or hearing loss on development and communication, and comprehensive communication approaches for young children with complex needs. Jan has had extensive training in types of visual impairments, hearing loss and amplification, specialized teaching techniques, and promoting compensatory skills. She works directly with infants who are blind and visually impaired, deaf or hard of hearing, and deafblind and is also responsible for overall program development and management for M.I.C.E..



Learning Objectives:

- 1) Participants will learn how to screen for vision or hearing concerns within the developmental assessment
- 2) Participants will learn about the auditory hierarchy and the development of listening skills.
- 3) Participants will learn about the development of vision and various eye conditions.
- 4) Participants will gain an understanding of the impact of vision or hearing loss on the child's learning and development
- 5) Participants will strategize on modifications and adaptations that will assist a young child in using vision or hearing more efficient

Tools for your Tool Belt is a 'hands' on workshop designed to assist Early Supports and Services providers with transdisciplinary service delivery with children who have visual and hearing impairments.

Participants will learn about the developmental progression of vision or auditory skills, how to screen for vision or hearing concerns during the developmental assessment, and tips and techniques for working with young children with vision or hearing loss. This session will include simulation of varied eye conditions or levels of hearing loss, adaptations for toys or activities, and strategies to modify the environment to assist young children to use their vision or hearing more efficiently. Review will be given for how to read and audiogram or an eye doctor's report.
